

Sunflower Swimming Pools Update and FAQ's

COVID-19 has created unprecedented times in Sunflower Village's history. The uncertainty it has created in all aspects of our lives is beyond unsettling. Your Board of Directors wants to answer some of your questions and alleviate a bit of the uncertainty for you. Be assured that the Board has been discussing the pool operations and is working diligently to follow state guidelines. Phone conversations have been held with the managers of other local swimming pools, including Colony Swim Club, The Summit, and other operators in an attempt to create best practices guidelines for this summer. We appreciate your patience in this process, and we hope to eventually see you all over the summer months.



Q: When will the pools open this summer?

A: As a nonessential organization we are unable to proceed with typical preseason opening preparations. Additionally, we are dependent on vendors and suppliers that are also shut down. It appears highly unlikely that the pools will be able to open as scheduled on May 23.

We still are hopeful that the pools will be able to open in some capacity this summer. Once the state's stay-at-home order has been lifted, and depending on any further restrictions that may be imposed, we hope to work with our vendors and suppliers to get the pools cleaned, filled, heated and opened in order to prepare for the summer. Please note that this process may take several weeks once we have permission to proceed.

We also need to hire the summer lifeguards — interviews were temporarily suspended with the initial March 24 shutdown order — and ensure all our lifeguards — new hires and returning guards — have the necessary certifications to protect you and your children.

Q: How will the Association ensure the safety and health of the members and staff if the pools are permitted to reopen this summer?

A: Health and safety always has been the primary goal of the Sunflower Village Homeowners Association, and the Board plans to continue to prioritize this goal. The Board will work closely with local and state health officials and incorporate their guidance and recommendations into our daily operating routine. You can expect to see some changes to our normal pool routine this summer, but at this time, we are uncertain what exactly that new routine will be. You can be assured that the Board will be reviewing our policies and making the necessary changes to abide by the latest health and safety regulations.

Q: When will swim lesson registration open?

A: At this time, swim lesson registration has been suspended for the summer. Once the Board knows what parameters the state and local authorities will impose on public swimming pools, the decision to hold swimming lessons will be reviewed and a date for registration, if appropriate, will be released at that time.

Q: What about the pool parties?

A: The Board will take into consideration any parameters provided by the state and local authorities before reviewing the scheduled pool parties. Information on these parties will be provided later.

ROADS



Everyone is excited to know that some roadwork has been scheduled for the summer of 2020. But unfortunately, COVID-19 has delayed some of those projects — delayed, but not cancelled!! Here's a list of some of the pending projects:

CANTON ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM:

Canton Township is excited to begin the second year of repairs to the roads in our community using the funding from the approved Road Millage. The intent of the Canton Road Improvement Program is to provide flexibility year-to-year to match

revenues from the millage to the prioritize projects.

2020 PRIMARY ROAD PROJECTS

Updated January 29, 2020 - The following is from the list of Major Road Projects: Canton Center Road/ Warren Road: The entire intersection as well as approximately 1,000 feet north of the intersection on Canton Center Road will be repaired.

And we're excited to share with you that 29 subdivisions applied for and were chosen to take part in the local match program. Sunflower was among those subdivision chosen!! Construction on the following subdivisions is scheduled to take place in 2020 and 2021: (Please note — while these projects have not been cancelled, they are delayed due to COVID-19). The storm sewers are in "private" easements and therefore neither Canton Township nor Sunflower Village Homes Association are responsible for their upkeep. The Association is responsible for storm sewers in the commons property of the Association.

TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES

FYI - As we get ready for spring and summer, homeowners who own boats and campers will be getting them ready to use. Township ordinances allow temporary parking of boats and campers for 72 hours prior to and after use of the recreational vehicle. However, the homeowner can get a permit twice a year for 2 weeks to keep the vehicle/boat on their property while they prep it, make repairs or clean it. The permit must be displayed on the vehicle/boat in a visible place.

DUES – PAY A SMALLER AMOUNT NOW OR A LARGER AMOUNT LATER


Thank you to all the residents who have paid their dues on time. The deadline for 2020 dues of \$270 was March 1. An initial \$35 late fee has been assessed to delinquent accounts.

However, because of the impact of the coronavirus, the board voted not to assess additional \$35 late fees in April and in May if accounts are paid in full by June 1. So, if you haven't paid yet, you owe \$305 until June 1. But as of June 2, additional late fees may be reassessed.

Dues can be mailed to the office (postmarked June 1 or earlier) or placed in the drop box at the Hanford or Gainsborough clubhouses before 9am on the 2nd.

We realize that these are difficult times for many residents — and the Association wants to work with all of our residents. So if you are feeling the financial pinch of COVID-19, please call the office and set up a payment plan. All details will be kept confidential. If you need help or have concerns, please call the Sunflower Office at 734-453-2022.

And if you've already paid your 2020 dues, we thank you!





Residents who see unauthorized vehicles in the commons are asked to notify the Canton Police, even if the vehicles are gone.

TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES - LEGAL REMINDERS

Since Sunflower has a substantial turn-over rate of homeowners each year, we feel it's necessary to repeat certain information on a regular basis. If you've read this information before then please bear with us as we try to inform new homeowners who might not be aware of the information. The Association receives numerous calls regarding ordinance violations. These complaints may be called directly to the Canton Township Ordinance Department. They will handle the call in an expedient manner. The following summarized list are good reminders for Spring:

- Trees are to be pruned so public sidewalks have clear headroom of 7 feet (this includes trees that Wayne County planted between your sidewalk and the street).
- Grass is not to be taller than 5 inches
- No junk or unlicensed vehicles except in a completely enclosed garage.
- Temporary parking of boats and campers is permitted for 48
 hours prior to and after use of the recreational vehicle unless
 a special permit is obtained from Canton Township (permit is
 to be displayed on the boat or camper (see article on page 11
 for further clarification).
- Dogs must be leashed and homeowners must clean up after their dogs. Fecal matter must be disposed on the owners property (please do not use the trash cans in the Commons to dispose of fecal matter it's unsanitary and unpleasant).
- Cars may not be parked at the end of a driveway so as to block the sidewalk.

SLOW DOWN PLEASE!!

Please be aware of the speed you're driving on our subdivision roads and do not exceed the speed limit of 25. Do not put others in danger by speeding in the neighborhood.

Spring - we've waited a long time for spring this year! Time to be outside again!! The Commons Areas will become more active as we jog, walk our dogs, play ball, fly kites, etc.

PLEASE USE A LITTLE "COMMONS SENSE" WHEN USING COMMONS AREAS.

Please DO NOT BUILD TREE HOUSES in the Commons.

Please NO DUMPING in the Commons and/or storm sewers. That includes grass clippings, shrub trimmings, tree limbs, old couches, motor oil, chairs or mattresses (you wouldn't believe the amount of stuff we find in our wooded areas). Please help us keep our Commons and sewers clean.

Please be respectful of other's property. When playing ball in the Commons, please hit the balls away from the houses. If the ball goes over someone's fence, ring their doorbell to retrieve your ball rather than climb their fence. Wiffle balls are a good choice for the Commons, both for baseball and golf.

Remember the **DOGGIE DOO-DOOS** and **DON'TS**:



<u>DO</u> clean up after your dog ("it is unlawful for any person to permit their dog to deposit fecal matter in any place other

than the premises where the dog is kept, unless such dog waste is removed immediately and disposed of on the premises where the dog is kept." Canton Township ordinance). Please DO NOT DEPOSIT BAGS OF DOG WASTE IN THE TRASH CANS AROUND THE CLUBHOUSES. It's your responsibility to dispose of it at your home.

DON'T allow your dog to run free in the neighborhood - there is a leash law in Canton.

DO remember your neighbors when your dog is outside and barking for a length of time. Please be mindful of how long your dog is barking as it can be a disturbance to neighbors!

DON'T let your dog run around inside the tennis courts.

CATS that are left free to roam have caused damage to neighbors property by scratching patio furniture. Their meows throughout the night are disturbing. Please take care that your cat does not bother others.

This column addresses items of interest that you, as homeowners, raise.

Q: Should we pay our dues since we are moving in April?

A: Please pay your dues now to avoid additional charges. When you sell your home, the Title Company that handles the closing needs to contact the Association for a Status Letter (this will tell them that your dues are paid in full through 12/31/20). The Title Company will then prorate the dues as of your closing date. Your closing statement will show a credit for the portion of the year that you do not own the home and the buyers statement will show a charge for their portion. The Association does not refund any portion of the dues.

If you are planning to sell your home it would be helpful if you would let your Title Company know they need to contact the Association for a Status Letter.



PSST! DO YOU WANT TO SAVE \$35 TO \$70?



By paying your 2020 dues today or by calling to set up a payment plan, you can freeze your dues at \$305 (saving \$35 to \$70 in additional late fees).

All payment plan details are confidential and you will not be charged additional late fees as long as you keep the payment schedule current. The Association offers payment plans of 2 to 5 payments (a \$3 service fee will be charged for each payment). Use of the pools and rental of the Clubhouse is suspended until all dues and charges are paid in full. You must call now to avoid additional late fees.

Paint guns and BB guns are not to be used in the Sunflower Commons areas. Canton ordinances 70.115 and 70.116 state that it is unlawful to discharge any air gun, bow and arrow, and slingshot except at an approved target range. The ordinance also states that a police officer can confiscate these items and legally dispose of them when a violation occurs. Please respect the safety of our community by only

LAWN MOWING TIPS



- 1. Please do not blow grass clippings into the street. The build-up blocks the drains and the water can't flow properly when it rains.
- 2. Please give the neighbors a chance to wake-up before you start mowing in the morning.
- 3. Mowing the island on the Cul-de-sacs is the responsibility of the homeowners that border the Cul-de-sac. Neighbors could work out a schedule of taking turns to cut that area.









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FROM CANTON TOWNSHIP DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:



Please keep the fire hydrant in front of your home cleared of vegetation overgrowth. It is critical to the firefighting operation to have fire hydrants readily available when needed. If a fire were to occur, and the closest hydrant were not visible or

useable due to vegetation precious time could be lost locating and stretching hose to the next available hydrant. Help the fire department by trimming around the hydrant.

SUNFLOWER CLUBHOUSES

The Association rents the Clubhouses to Sunflower residents for special events and parties. We do not rent to non-residents. If you, as a Sunflower resident, rent the Clubhouse for a friend who is not a resident, you bear the responsibility for the care and cleaning of the Clubhouse. We remind you that as the renter, you have agreed to attend the event and act as host or hostess.

Clubhouse Rentals and Covid19

As part of our ethical obligation to the health and safety of our community, Sunflower Village Homes Association will be following Governor Whitmer's stay-at-home orders.

Due to the orders we have unfortunately had to cancel many gatherings at our club houses. As of right now, all gatherings are cancelled through May 15th with the option to reschedule to a later date or receive a refund.
