If you owe for multiple years, please make payment immediately to avoid further late fees and legal fees.



STORM SEWERS IN HOMEOWNER'S EASEMENT

It is the responsibility of each individual homeowner to maintain, repair and/or replace the easement and improvements which service each lot (i.e. storm sewer), since this is the portion of the system that is for the sole benefit of each particular homeowner. The responsibility for maintaining and repairing same is set forth in the Covenants and Restrictions of Sunflower Village Homes Association. The storm sewers are in "private" easements and therefore neither Canton Township nor Sunflower Village Homes Association are responsible for their upkeep. The Association is responsible for storm sewers in the commons property of the Association.

DUES - PAY A SMALL AMOUNT NOW OR A LARGE AMOUNT LATER

Thank you to all the residents who have paid their dues on time! 2020 Dues were due March 1st. A \$35 late fee has been assessed to delinquent accounts. If you have not paid your 2020 dues, please send payment of \$305 by March 31st or additional late charges will accrue.

When a delinquency goes into its second year, the Association files a lien on the subject property. If the liens are not paid, the Association will file a foreclosure lawsuit or a money judgment. Any of these actions will cost the homeowner a significant amount of money.

The Association still offers **payment plans** to homeowners who request one. **Please call the office immediately** - all details are kept confidential. Use of the pools and rental of the Clubhouse is suspended until all dues and charges are paid in full.

If you are a homeowner who has paid his/her dues or are participating in a payment plan, we appreciate your efforts and we are doing everything we can to hold all homeowners to the same accountability.

If you are an owner who is delinquent on your dues, we highly recommend that you contact the Association and establish a payment plan for past dues and late fees. If the Association is forced to file a lien and foreclosure or a money judgment, the Association Board is committed to pursuing not only payment of dues and late fees, but also reimbursement of any and all associated legal fees.

Residents who see unauthorized vehicles in the commons are asked to notify the Canton Police, even if the vehicles are gone.

TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES - LEGAL REMINDERS

Since Sunflower has a substantial turn-over rate of homeowners each year, we feel it's necessary to repeat certain information on a regular basis. If you've read this information before then please bear with us as we try to inform new homeowners who might not be aware of the information. The Association receives numerous calls regarding ordinance violations. These complaints may be called directly to the Canton Township Ordinance Department. They will handle the call in an expedient manner. The following summarized list are good reminders for Spring:

- Trees are to be pruned so public sidewalks have clear headroom of 7 feet (this includes trees that Wayne County planted between your sidewalk and the street).
- Grass is not to be taller than 5 inches
- No junk or unlicensed vehicles except in a completely enclosed garage.
- Temporary parking of boats and campers is permitted for 48
 hours prior to and after use of the recreational vehicle unless
 a special permit is obtained from Canton Township (permit is
 to be displayed on the boat or camper (see article on page 11
 for further clarification).
- Dogs must be leashed and homeowners must clean up after their dogs. Fecal matter must be disposed on the owners property (please do not use the trash cans in the Commons to dispose of fecal matter it's unsanitary and unpleasant).
- Cars may not be parked at the end of a driveway so as to block the sidewalk.

SLOW DOWN PLEASE!!

Please be aware of the speed you're driving on our subdivision roads and do not exceed the speed limit of 25. Do not put others in danger by speeding in the neighborhood.

Spring - we've waited a long time for spring this year! Time to be outside again!! The Commons Areas will become more active as we jog, walk our dogs, play ball, fly kites, etc.

PLEASE USE A LITTLE "COMMONS SENSE" WHEN USING COMMONS AREAS.

Please DO NOT BUILD TREE HOUSES in the Commons.

Please NO DUMPING in the Commons and/or storm sewers. That includes grass clippings, shrub trimmings, tree limbs, old couches, motor oil, chairs or mattresses (you wouldn't believe the amount of stuff we find in our wooded areas). Please help us keep our Commons and sewers clean.

Please be respectful of other's property. When playing ball in the Commons, please hit the balls away from the houses. If the ball goes over someone's fence, ring their doorbell to retrieve your ball rather than climb their fence. Wiffle balls are a good choice for the Commons, both for baseball and golf.

Remember the **DOGGIE DOO-DOOS** and **DON'TS**:



DO clean up after your dog ("it is unlawful for any person to permit their dog to deposit fecal matter in any place other

than the premises where the dog is kept, unless such dog waste is removed immediately and disposed of on the premises where the dog is kept." Canton Township ordinance). Please DO NOT DEPOSIT BAGS OF DOG WASTE IN THE TRASH CANS AROUND THE CLUBHOUSES. It's your responsibility to dispose of it at your home.

DON'T allow your dog to run free in the neighborhood - there is a leash law in Canton.

DO remember your neighbors when your dog is outside and barking for a length of time. Please be mindful of how long your dog is barking as it can be a disturbance to neighbors!

DON'T let your dog run around inside the tennis courts.

CATS that are left free to roam have caused damage to neighbors property by scratching patio furniture. Their meows throughout the night are disturbing. Please take care that your cat does not bother others.

This column addresses items of interest that you, as homeowners, raise.

Q: Should we pay our dues since we are moving in April?

A: Please pay your dues now to avoid additional charges. When you sell your home, the Title Company that handles the closing needs to contact the Association for a Status Letter (this will tell them that your dues are paid in full through 12/31/20). The Title Company will then prorate the dues as of your closing date. Your closing statement will show a credit for the portion of the year that you do not own the home and the buyers statement will show a charge for their portion. The Association does not refund any portion of the dues.

If you are planning to sell your home it would be helpful if you would let your Title Company know they need to contact the Association for a Status Letter.

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PSST! DO YOU WANT TO SAVE \$35 TO \$70?



By paying your 2020 dues today or by calling to set up a payment plan, you can freeze your dues at \$305 (saving \$35 to \$70 in additional late fees).

All payment plan details are confidential and you will not be charged additional late fees as long as you keep the payment schedule current. The Association offers payment plans of 2 to 5 payments (a \$3 service fee will be charged for each payment). Use of the pools and rental of the Clubhouse is suspended until all dues and charges are paid in full. You must call by March 31st to avoid another late fee.

FYI - As we get ready for spring and summer, homeowners who own boats and campers will be getting them ready to use. Township ordinances allow temporary parking of boats and campers for 48 hours prior to and after use of the recreational vehicle in your driveway. However, the homeown-



er can get a permit twice a year for 2 weeks to keep the vehicle/boat in their driveway while they prep it, make repairs or clean it. The permit must be displayed on the vehicle/boat in a visible place.
