2017 DUES ARE NOW DUE

(Last reminder before 3/1 deadline)

2017 dues are payable from January 1st to March 1st without penalty. Payments can be mailed to the office or delivered in person to the Hanford or Gainsborough drop boxes. Dues must be in the drop boxes at the clubhouse by midnight March 1st or be postmarked no later than March 1st. Late fees will be charged as of March 2nd (see chart on page 2).

If you are experiencing a financial hardship and you will not be able to pay your dues in full by March 1st, please contact the office to set up a payment plan. We have plans for 2 to 5 payments with the first payment due March 1st and subsequent payments due on the 1st of each month (If you will want to use the pool on opening day your dues must be paid in full by Tuesday, May 23, 2017). A \$3 service fee is included in each payment. A \$35 late fee will be applied each time a payment is 30 days in arrears.

NOTE: Making a partial payment will be considered as a payment plan and service fees will be assessed at \$3/payment.

Dues invoices were mailed to every homeowner of record on December 6th. If you did not receive an invoice please call the office and request a copy. Every homeowner receives one notice in December and then the January/February Newsletter as reminders. Please return the 2017 registration form with your dues payment even if there are no changes in the information stated. This helps us to keep our records up-to-date.

A lien will be placed on your property if you fail to pay your dues or if you default on your payment plan. The homeowner will be responsible for all legal fees incurred if a lien is filed. If your dues (including all other fees owed) are not paid in full, you will not be able to use the pools or clubhouses until the entire balance has been paid. Thank you for your timely payments!



The 2017 dues are \$270/home (bills were mailed in early-December). Dues are payable from January 1st—March 1st without a penalty. If dues are paid after March 1st the following late fees will accrue:

- Plumbing updates at Hanford Clubhouse
- Gainsborough Clubhouse siding & exterior improvements approved and scheduled for Spring 2017
- New Computers installed in Association office with additional local backup system
- Tree removal and maintenance in Commons Areas
- Great annual picnic with music and new activity (Zorb balls)
- Successful egg hunt
- Excellent lifeguard staff who helped with several struggling children at the pools
- Successful swim lessons with hundreds of kids enrolled

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Sunflower Village Homes is looking for qualified people for the following positions:

LIFEGUARDS - Red Cross certified lifeguards. Must be 16 or older. Full and part time positions available from early May to Labor Day. Pick up an application at the Sunflower Office. Please apply by March 1st. Work permit is required.

POOL MAINTENANCE - Early mornings, 2-4 hours daily, vacuum pool, routine maintenance, adding chemicals to pool. Must be 18 or older. Does require some physical labor. Positions available from early May to Labor Day. Pick up an application at the Sunflower Office.

<u>SNOW</u> - Help the Association & and your neighbors with Snow Removal by following a few simple suggestions:

- Please move your car out of the street if a snow storm is predicted. Parked cars prohibit the plow from being able to plow curb to curb. Police will ticket cars parked on streets during snow emergencies.
- Shoveling or blowing the snow from your driveway back into the street creates ruts as it freezes & thaws making the road more hazardous. Also, you can be fined for putting the snow back in the street.
 Please do not put snow back into the street.
 Putting snow back into the street prevents the snow removal company from plowing effectively!!
- Plowing is done if the snowfall is 2" or greater.
- Salting the streets is NOT part of our contract. We salt select intersections each time the streets are plowed. (Wayne County spreads sand on icy roads when they deem it necessary).
- For a "normal" snowfall (2-4") plowing will not begin until the majority of the storm is over and the snow plow company then has 24 hours to complete the plowing. For a large snowfall (over 6") plowing will take place throughout the storm to try to keep up with the snow. The plow company will need additional time to clear the snow (48-60 hours). Please be patient!

- Tree branches that overhang the street create a problem for the plow and they are not able to get close to the curb. The plow will go around the area and leave it unplowed if there isn't clearance.
- The plow tries to get as close as they can to the curb but staking your property will let them know where the curb is, especially if you live on a curve or a cul-de-sac.
- The snow removal company is not responsible for damage to sprinkler heads or lawns that are not clearly marked.
- When the plow comes through there will be snow plowed back into your driveway or piled up at the end of your driveway. It happens to all of us - we all have to shovel back out. If you are unable to do so, please consider calling one of our snow removal "helping hands" to help you.
- Group Mailbox Members, it is your responsibility to clear out your group mailbox and keep it free from ice. Maybe those who share the box could take turns with that responsibility so everyone can get their mail in a timely manner. If the area around the box is not safe for the mail carrier, he/she will not leave the mail.
- Please shovel out fire hydrants near your home for easy access.

Help us to have a smooth running snow removal season by following the tips mentioned above. A little cooperation goes a long way. And please be patient! It takes time to plow the entire sub.


