Dues Increase

Sunflower has not needed a dues increase since 2015, due to the responsible management of the budget by the current and previous board of directors. Many improvements have been realized during this time while maintaining the dues at \$270.

For the past two sessions, Sunflower Village Homes has been able to pay the deposit to participate in the Canton Township Road Repair project. Once again we met the 20% match required by Canton Township in order to participate in the next program scheduled for 2022 without having to ask residents to approve a special assessment. However, in order to continue to meet these contributions, a dedicated road fund may be necessary.

Due to significantly increasing costs, the board is evaluating whether it is time to request a modest increase in our dues. This year we saw a remarkable increase in the cost of pool chemicals, cleaning supplies and other services necessary to maintain our subdivision interests. Additionally, the minimum wage is increasing, and that impacts our seasonal staff.

The board of directors is reviewing every option to manage the operating budget on the existing dues, but without an increase, significant cuts to the pool hours, picnic, facility access and other events might be needed.

Storm drain reminder

As a reminder, the storm drains in homeowners' backyards need to be maintained by the homeowner/ surrounding homeowners who benefit from that drain.

Homeowners have often shared in the cost of any necessary repairs. Tree roots and other debris can cause issues and blockages with drainage. Periodic maintenance checks on the drains are recommended. A local plumber can do these maintenance checks. With the aging trees in the neighborhood, it is a good idea to be sure the drains are free of roots before problems occur. It is also highly recommended that no plantings are put in the easement or near the storm drain/line. Trees may need to be removed if their roots are a recurring problem to the storm drain system.

DUES – PAY A SMALL AMOUNT NOW **OR A LARGE AMOUNT LATER**

Thank you to all the residents who have paid their dues on time! 2021 Dues were due March 1.

If you have not paid your 2021 dues, you now owe \$375. This payment may be made at the Sunflower Clubhouse on • Hanford. If you still own a balance, please pay it off before the end of the year.

If you are delinquent for two years, the Association will file a lien on the subject property. If the lien is not paid, the Association will file a foreclosure lawsuit or a money judgment. Any of these actions will cost the homeowner a significant amount of money. The association is committed to recovering all legal fees associated with dues recovery efforts.

Use of the pools and rental of the clubhouses are suspended until all dues and charges are paid in full.

If you are a homeowner who has paid his/her dues or are participating in a payment plan, we appreciate your efforts and we are doing everything we can to hold all homeowners to the same accountability.
