News for and about members of the Sunflower Village Homes Association

2022 ASSOCIATION DUES ARE NOW DUE \$325 (Last reminder before 3/1 deadline)

The association has voted to increase the 2022 dues to \$325. Dues are payable from January 1 to March 1 without penalty. It is recommended residents deliver payments to the office in person or drop in the mail slot to the right of the front door of the Hanford Clubhouse. We ask you return the original green registration form with your dues payment and make checks payable to **Sunflower Village Homes**. Dues must be in the drop box at the clubhouse by midnight March 1 or be postmarked no later than March 1.*Note: we do not recommend mailing dues as the association will not assume any responsibility for mail not delivered.* Late fees will be charged as of March 2 (see chart on Page 2). There are 15 lots out of 1,683 that still owe money for the 2021 dues.

If you are experiencing financial hardship and you cannot pay your dues in full by March 1, please contact the office to set up a payment plan. We have plans for 2 to 5 payments with the first payment due March 1 and subsequent payments due on the first of each month. (If you will want to use the pool on opening day your dues must be paid in full by Tuesday, May 24, 2022.) A \$3 service fee is included in each payment. A \$35 late fee will be applied each time a payment is 30 days in arrears.

NOTE: Making a partial payment will be considered a payment plan and service fees will be assessed at \$3 a payment.

Dues invoices were mailed to every homeowner of record on December 10. If you did not receive an invoice please call the office and request a copy. Every homeowner receives one invoice in December and then the January/February Newsletter serves as a reminder. Please return the 2022 registration form with your dues payment even if there are no changes in the information stated. This helps us to keep our records up-to-date.

A lien will be placed on your property if you fail to pay your dues or if you default on your payment plan. The homeowner will be responsible for all legal fees incurred if a lien is filed. If your dues (including all other fees owed) are not paid in full, you will not be able to use the pools or clubhouses until the entire balance has been paid.

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Association Dues

The 2022 dues will increase to \$325 a home (bills were mailed in early December). Dues are payable from January 1- March 1 without a penalty. If dues are paid after March 1, the following late fees will accrue:

Please pay your dues on time to avoid additional charges.

After May 1, interest will be charged at 6% per year.

If the Association has to file a lien against your property for non-payment of dues, you will be responsible for all legal fees incurred.

LEGAL REMINDERS



Shoveling or blowing snow from your driveway into the street creates ruts as it freezes and thaws, making the road more hazardous and preventing the plows from effectively doing their job. <u>You can be fined for putting</u> the snow in the street.

Please do not put snow in the street!!



If a snow emergency has been declared in Canton you must move your vehicle(s) out of the street per Canton Township ordinance. Residents may call the non-emergency police number to report cars parked in the street during a snow emergency and the vehicles will be ticketed.

STORM SEWERS IN HOMEOWNER'S EASEMENT

It is the responsibility of each individual homeowner to maintain, repair and/or replace the storm sewer in the easement that services each individual lot, since this is the portion of the system that is for the sole benefit of each particular homeowner.

The responsibility for maintaining and repairing storm sewers is set forth in the Covenants and Restrictions of Sunflower Village Homes Association. The storm sewers are in "private" easements and therefore neither Canton Township nor Sunflower Village Homes Association is responsible for their upkeep. The Association is responsible for storm sewers in the commons property of the Association.

STATE OF THE VILLAGE

2021 has been a difficult year and all of us have been impacted by the COVID pandemic in some way. Sunflower is no different. We have had to cancel some of the annual activities and operate under a slightly limited budget due to restrictions. However, I would like to focus on the accomplishments and positive changes that occurred in Sunflower throughout 2021.

The Board of Directors and management team continued to have regular monthly meetings throughout the year when restrictions did not enable us to have in person meetings. We used Zoom to allow homeowners to participate and listen to the general meetings. When restrictions were modified mid-year, we were again able to have open Board meetings at the clubhouse.

The following are some of the Board and the office's accomplishments this year:

- Replaced a Hanford pool filter.
- Replaced the sand in both filters at the Gainsborough pool, which fixed a water clarity issue that temporarily closed the pool this summer.
- Replaced the caulking around the Gainsborough pool.
- A large backwash drain was cleared at the Gainsborough clubhouse. The persistency and follow up with several contractors by the Maintenance Manager saved the association from tearing up the parking lot and replacing this drain.
- The fire suppression system controller was replaced at the Gainsborough clubhouse and both of the clubhouse systems were serviced
- A leaking hot water holding tank will be replaced at the Hanford clubhouse.
- The lawn sprinkler controller was replaced at Hanford, and approximately 60 sprinkler heads were replaced between both club-houses.
- Major structural improvements at the Gainsborough clubhouse were completed earlier this year which allowed us to open the clubhouse for rentals and open the pool bathrooms for pool season.
- Both pools were open for a successful pool season which saw the return of swim lessons.
- The Social Committee organized several events such as Game Night, the Bike Rally, Trunk or Treat, and the 4th of July Bike Parade.

The association made a \$40,000 contribution this year to participate in the Canton Township local road improvement program for 2022. This is an 80/20 match program in conjunction with Canton Township. Our \$40,000 contributions gains us an additional \$160,000 in roadwork. We look forward to seeing road improvements in 2022.

2021 proved to be a challenging year with increases seen in Sunflower's expenses due to wage spending increases, increased spending on professional fees, maintenance contract changes, and unforeseen repairs. The Board and Office have worked hard to keep the budget balanced for the year but will not be able to make the recommended capital reserve account contribution for 2021. As this challenging year comes to an end, Sunflower's finances and reserves remain strong.

I would like to encourage homeowners to communicate with the board by attending our monthly association meetings, calling the office, or by using the association website. I encourage homeowners to volunteer to help with our annual activities. Without volunteers these great events would not be possible.

In closing I must say we all can be very proud to live in Sunflower Village. We continue to provide an environment that is desirable to live in as well as good home values. Thank you,

If that does not happen, then we don't know that a property changed hands and the dues notice was probably mailed to the previous owner. Board meetings are no longer being held via Zoom.

<u>SNOW</u> - Help the Association and your neighbors with snow removal by following a few simple suggestions:

- Please move your car out of the street if a snowstorm is predicted. Parked cars prohibit the plow from being able to plow curb to curb. Police will ticket cars parked on streets during snow emergencies.
- Please do not put snow in the street. Putting snow into the street prevents the snow plow from plowing effectively!!
- Shoveling or blowing the snow from your driveway into the street creates ruts as it freezes and thaws, making the road more hazardous. Also, you can be fined for putting the snow back in the street.. Plowing is done if the snowfall is two inches or greater.
- Salting the entire subdivision is NOT part of our contract. We salt select intersections each time the streets are plowed. (Wayne County spreads sand on icy roads when it deems it necessary.)
- For a "normal" snowfall (2-4"), plowing will not begin until the majority of the storm is over. The plow company then has 24 hours to complete the plowing. For a large snowfall (over 6"), plowing will take place throughout the storm to try to keep up with the snow. The plow company will need additional time to clear the snow (48-60 hours).

Please be patient!

• <u>The snow removal company is not responsible for damage</u> to sprinkler heads or lawns that are not clearly marked.

- Tree branches that overhang the street create a problem for the plow and they are not able to get close to the curb. The plow will go around the area and leave it unplowed if there isn't clearance.
- The plow tries to get as close as it can to the curb but staking your property will let drivers know where the curb is, especially if you live on a curve or a cul-de-sac.
- When the plow comes through there will be snow plowed back into your driveway or piled up at the end of your driveway. It happens to all of us - we all have to shovel back out.
- <u>Group Mailbox Members, it is your responsibility to clear out your</u> <u>group mailbox and keep it free from ice.</u> Maybe those who share the box could take turns with that responsibility so that everyone can get their mail in a timely manner. <u>If the area around the box is not safe</u> <u>for the mail carrier, he/she will not leave the mail.</u>
- It is your responsibility to shovel out fire hydrants near your home for easy access. You may save someone's life by doing so. Plus, it's also a township ordinance that all fire hydrants must be shoveled out.

Help the neighborhood have a smooth-running snow removal season by following the tips mentioned above. A little cooperation goes a long way. And please be patient! It takes time to plow the entire subdivision.

Commons Areas

Our open areas are one of the most desirable aspects of Sunflower. And we invite all our residents to take advantage of these areas and enjoy them. But we also ask residents to follow a few established guidelines.

- Remember that when enjoying the commons areas, the use of motorized vehicles is prohibited. This includes four-wheel vehicles, dune buggies, go-carts, dirt bikes, snowmobiles and ATVs.
- Personal property, including playscapes, trampolines and lawn furniture, may not be built or placed in the commons areas.
- No personal property of any type may be left in the wooded areas. Treehouses, pathways and gathering areas are not permitted. Wooded areas are to remain natural.
- The commons are a great area to walk your dog, but remember to clean up after your pet. The other residents (and dogs) will appreciate it.
- Finally, please be conscious of the noise you make. An early morning stroll is lovely, but remember there are houses around the commons and those residents may not appreciate being woken at an early hour.


Sunflower Village Homes is seeking a positive, self-motivated, detailed-oriented individual who has an exceptional ability to organize, prioritize and multi-task.
