\$2,000,000!!!

We are thrilled to announce that the Sunflower Board has secured \$1,948,570 from the Legislative Earmark grant sponsored by State Representative Ranjeev Puri to be used for road reconstruction projects affected by alkalislica reaction (ASR) cement for Canton Township to revamp roads in Sunflower 8 this summer.

As part of the agreement, this grant is to be combined with the 2024 Road contribution already dedicated to repairs at the Beck/Swanmere Sunflower entrance, resulting in an additional \$300,000 to be added towards this reconstruction, plus we were required to pull forward our current 2025 and 2026 Canton Road Fund match contributions. All of this results in funding over \$2,000,000.

Sunflower 8 marks the FIRST project in Canton to benefit from these ASR funds. Various other HOAs in Canton Township will receive portions of the State of Michigan Legislative Earmark Grant in the upcoming years. Construction is currently scheduled to kick off in June and will continue throughout the summer. Initial plans suggest that work will commence on one half of the street before shifting to the other half for completion. Note: Residents on the half under repair will not have driveway access. We encourage neighbors to collaborate and share driveway spaces during construction.

The Sunflower Road Committee

Established in the Spring of 2013, the Sunflower Road Committee comprised board members and residents passionate about addressing road issues. Their goal has been to identify ways to enhance the conditions of the 17 linear miles of roads in Sunflower Subdivision.

The PASER Study

In the spring of 2016, the Sunflower Roads Committee engaged SME Engineering to conduct a Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating (PASER) study on our deteriorating roads. The study's outcomes have significantly aided in providing Canton Township with vital information and identifying annual road projects.

The Journey to Improvement

Securing funding for the road enhancements in Sunflower 8 has been a lengthy process involving multiple Sunflower Boards and members over the past decade-plus. Special thanks to Bob Parker, Khalil Kandah, Lori Rysdorp, Ann McGowan, Melissa Lichtman, and Ron LeTourneau for their dedication to our road initiatives over the past years.

We will provide updates as new information emerges.

Red Dot Testing

- * Required for all qualified helpers or for children ages 9-11 to swim unsupervised
 - Testing will be done M-W-F from 8-9 p.m. at the GAINSBOROUGH POOL (once summertime hours begin)
 - Parents must be on deck during testing and will be asked to sit in the designated area while their child takes the test
 - Parents may not coach their child during the test
 - There is a one-week waiting period if a child needs retesting
 - Parents must complete a "Red Dot Test Form" before their child is tested and must sign up before 7 p.m. on the day of testing
 - Parent's must provide an emergency phone number before their 9-11 year old may use the pool without their supervision.

Skills to be tested:

- 25 yards freestyle
- 25 yards backstroke
- 25 yards breaststroke
- 25 yards elementary backstroke
- Dive from edge of pool
- Retrieve ring from bottom of deep end
- Tread water for two minutes
- Knowledge of what to do in a pool emergency
- Knowledge of pool safety rules

Guest Passes

Only homeowners may purchase guest passes and they must accompany their guests to the pool. All guests must check in at the gate.

- \$10.00 for 5 passes
- \$3.00 for Individual Passes

You can host a maximum of 6 guests per lot A guest is anyone who does not live in your home.

Pool Closings

Our Pools will close early if the weather dictates or if there are problems that create a health concern. If problems occur, please be understanding. Lightning can strike up to 10 miles from the eye of a storm. This is why the pool staff closes the pool when there is lightning or thunder. The pool will remain closed for 1 hour following the last streak of lightning or rumble of thunder.

We work with the local health department to minimize the amount of time pools will be closed due to a biohazard. The minimal amount of time is 30 minutes but could be extended depending the the pool chemical readings or the type of biohazard that occurred.

Please help keep biohazard accidents to a minimum by following a few simple guidelines:

- Don't let children use the pool if they are not feeling well
- · Wait an hour after eating before swimming
- Have your child take regular bathroom breaks
- Follow diaper rules
- Have your child take a break if they have swallowed a lot of water and have come up gagging

- Resident dues must be current to register your children on a first-come, first-served basis
- Children must be at least five years old to be registered.
- The registration will require a parent's signature.
- · Cost for a two-week session (Monday-Thursday) are
 - \$65 if pre-registered May 10- June 10 OR if you are registering the same child for a second session.
 - You must register for the second/third session before the Thursday before the first day of the lesson.
- All fees are due at the time of registration
 - Checks should be made out to "Sunflower Village Homeowners Association"
- Fridays are reserved for make-up sessions if a class is canceled due to bad weather.
 - If the temperature is below 65 degrees at 9:30 a.m., lessons may be canceled for the day.
- · No refunds will be issued for missed classes.
- Pre-testing will take place the week before each session. Sign-up for pre-testing will occur at the time of sign-up.
- Any registrations after May 10 will be handled through the Sunflower Office during normal business hours on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Private lessons are not available.
- NO REGISTRATION WILL BE TAKEN AT THE POOL
 - The cut-off for registration is 12 p.m. (noon) on the Thursday prior to the start of Monday's session.
- Non-residents who register will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified by 3 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the start of class if openings are available
 - Cost for non-residents is \$70
- No refunds will be given unless the session is canceled due to low enrollment.


Please pick up your pet waste

Lawn Mowing Tips

- Please do not blow grass clippings into the street.
 The build-up of grass clippings at our drains causes blockage and does not allow water to drain properly when it rains.
- Please be respectful of your neighbors and refrain from mowing your grass early in the morning.
- Mowing the island on the Cul-de-sacs is the responsibility of the homeowners that border the Cul-de-sac. Consider working out a mowing schedule where everyone can take turns cutting that area.
